Sports Funders

The March/April issue of Funding Opportunities usually contains information about a number of Sports funders.

The Borough Council has recently produced a Funding For Sport leaflet which most people on the Funding Opportunities mailing list should have received either in January or with this issue.

The document was prepared in late 2008 and we are not aware of any major changes other than to Awards For All and Sport England so we have included updates in this issue of Funding Opportunities.

1. Awards For All – Important Changes

The current Awards For All scheme is closing to applications on 31 March 2009. Their website states that further details will be available by 1 April 2009.

Awards For All currently funds a range of projects with grants available from £300 to £10,000. It is not clear exactly what the changes will be but it appears that each of the current Awards For All contributors will have their own grant schemes suitable for projects previously covered by Awards.

- Sport England is likely to have a new scheme for £300 - £10,000
- Big Lottery fund is likely to have its own scheme (possibly still called Awards For All) for £300 - £10,000
- Arts Council England and Heritage Lottery Fund are not likely to have a new scheme and applicants will need to check whether their project is eligible for their other funding streams

2. Sport England – Rural Communities

As part of its re-vamp Sport England has decided to have themed rounds to its grant funding programmes.

The first theme of the new scheme is Rural Communities which is good news for West Norfolk.

Rural areas have been chosen as the focus because there is a reduced choice of sporting activities, transportation issues, and lower levels of participation.

How much for?

- A minimum of £10,000 and they are expecting a significant proportion of grants to be for over £500,000

What for?

- New and innovative projects that overcome barriers to participation and supply
- Projects should be high impact and demonstrate high value for money
- Projects must contribute towards one of their two outcomes:
 - Growing participation in grassroots sport
 - Sustaining participation by improving the quality of people's sporting experience

Who can apply?/How to apply

- Local authorities, clubs and community groups can apply
- The Rural Communities theme opens on 1 April 2009
- There will be a 3 month period for initial outline applications
- Forms and guidance notes will be available from the website
- The next themed round will be announced on 1 September 2009
