How much for?

- One-off grants from £500 to £15,000
- Recurring grants for up to 3 years from £500 to £5,000 per annum

What for?

- Making a lasting difference to people's lives, by reducing isolation, stigma and discrimination
- A long list of priority groups (e.g. asylum seekers, offenders etc.) which includes older people
- For start-up, core, or project costs
- Eligible activities include:
 - Provision of advice or information
 - Advocacy
 - Befriending or mentoring
 - Social activities or drop-in centres
 - Practical work, such as gardening or recycling, which benefits both the provider and the recipient
 - Arts activities where the primary purpose is therapeutic or social

Who can apply?/How to apply

- Local organisations (whether or not registered charities) with a yearly income of less than £100,000
- Apply in writing and attach the proposal to a completed registration form
- The guidelines on the website explain the information that should be included in the application
- Applications can be made at any time

12. Lloyds TSB Foundations

- No minimum grant size

- Fill in application form
- If successful, you cannot apply again for 2 years; if unsuccessful you cannot apply again for 1 year

13.Age Concern – Small Grant Programme

Charity Commission number: 1128267

How much for?

- Small service development grants for up to £2,000

What for?

- Services which are of direct and lasting benefit to older people
- Examples include:
 - Day centres/lunch clubs
 - Information and advice
 - Visiting and befriending
 - Health and safety initiatives
 - Arts/cultural/reminiscence activities
 - Footcare
 - Bathing and hairdressing
 - Respite for carers
 - Gardening and domestic services
 - Enabling older people to have their voices heard
- Older people should be actively involved in the planning and running of the service

- Groups with an annual turnover of less than £250,000
- Applicants need a constitution and a bank account

14. The Henry Smith Charity**Charity Commission number: 230102****How much for?**

- Small Grants - £500 - £20,000 for organisations with an annual income of less than £150,000, for one-off capital items such as equipment purchase (which must be used within six months of the award), running costs, and repeat applications can be considered.
- Main Grants - of £10,000 or more per year for up to three years, for either capital or revenue costs.

What for?

- Projects providing residential care for the elderly, health care or emotional support, such as befriending services and day care centres. Priority will be given to projects in areas of high deprivation and those where rural isolation can be demonstrated.

- Organisations registered with the Charity Commission for at least two years
- Each grant programme has slightly different application process, read guidelines available on website

15. Dulverton Trust**Charity Commission number: 206426****How much for?**

- Major grants - £5,000 to £25,000 – usually for national and regional charities with annual income below £50 million
- Minor grants – up to £3,500 – for local charities with annual income below £400,000
- Funding generally for one year only but long-term support for major grants may be considered

What for?

- A variety of topics are funded including older people
- The projects funded include those that address the problems suffered by the increasing proportion of older people within the UK

Who can apply?/How to apply

- Registered charities or organisations with officially recognised charitable status
- Applications must be made in writing and be no more than two pages of A4
- Check the website to see what information should be included
- Applications can be submitted at any time but meetings take place in February, May, July, and October
- Whether successful or unsuccessful, charities must wait two years to reapply

How much for?

- Grants range between £75 and £750.
- Match funding is not a specified requirement; however the Trust favours applications where projects have attempted to raise funds themselves even if the amounts are small.

What for?

- The Trust provides grants for a variety of projects including:
 - Adult volunteering schemes;
 - Advice schemes;
 - Health schemes;
 - Neighbourhood associations;
 - Older people;
 - Projects set up by those who are socially excluded
- The Trust normally awards grants, where an initial £75 to £750 can make a real difference in the early stages of new and innovative projects

Who can apply?/How to apply

- Small registered charities, voluntary and community groups within the UK
- The Trust cannot make grants directly to a non-registered charity so if a small voluntary or community group applies a registered charity must be willing to accept the grant on their behalf
- These grants are for small groups so a project that employs staff will usually not be eligible although there are, on occasions, exceptions
- The Trust prefers to accept applications via its online form, although applications are accepted by letter
- Applications can be submitted at any time

- Single year grants up to £3,000
- 2-3 year grants up to £3,000 per year

What for?

- Grants to small charities to help sustain their existing work
- Running costs and salaries can be funded
- Various areas of interest including older people
- Recent grants include:
 - Caring for Carers Association - £7,500 over 3 years towards core costs of a volunteer befriending scheme working with elderly and ethnic minority carers in Hammersmith & Fulham

18.Trusthouse Charitable Foundation	Charity Commission number: 1063945
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How much for?

- Fast track – for applications of £5000 or less, for revenue and/or capital costs
- Small grants – for applications between £5001 and £9,999, for revenue and/or capital costs
- Large grants – for applications between £10,000 and £30,000, for capital appeals only

What for?

- Two overarching themes for grants: First theme is rural issues regarding villages/areas with less than 10,000 inhabitants e.g. providing transport for elderly, disabled or disadvantaged, encouraging sense of community etc. Second theme is urban deprivation i.e. working with residents of urban areas (more than 10,000 inhabitants) which are classified in government Indices of Multiple Deprivation as being in the lowest 20%.
- Projects aimed at elderly should clearly show how they fit into one of the themes, and should also address isolation and loneliness. Examples include befriending schemes, domiciliary support, and residential improvements/adaptations.

Who can apply?/How to apply

- Eligible to any charity or not-for-profit organisation which has existed for 12 months or more
- Application form available on website or can be requested from office
- Applications should be received 8 weeks before Grants Committee meetings held February, May, July, and November
