## 2. COMMA 2008 – The Community Aggregates Fund

### How much for?

- £3,000 up to maximum of £20,000

### What for?

- Improved access to the countryside and local facilities
- Improving a community space or community building
- Tree planting, allotments or green spaces
- Transport projects that can improve access to services and reduce car use
- Restoration of monuments/sites/structures and other arts and heritage projects
- Facilities for sports and other activities for children and young people
- Locally produced publications about local facilities and environment

### Who can apply?/How to apply

- The community where the project is based is/has been affected by aggregates extraction or transportation of aggregates
- The proposed project is within 10 kilometres of an aggregates extraction site, either current or disused
- The proposed project must benefit the whole community or a section of the community, not an individual
- The applicant must be a community organisation, a charity or a parish council
- All project works funded by COMMA grants this year must be capable of completion by the end of June 2009

- Priority will be given to projects that clearly demonstrate an energy efficiency or identify technology solutions to environmental improvements
- Schools may also apply for a selection of free energy saving white goods through the 'Switched on Communities' scheme
