<b>2. LankellyChase Foundation</b>	<b>Charity Commission no: 1107583</b>
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**How much for?**

- Up to £45,000 for the Breaking the Cycle

**What for?**

- The Foundation's Arts programme focuses on small local and regional organisations which use the arts to help vulnerable 11-21 year olds
- Breaking the Cycle programme focuses on:
  - Families at risk of domestic abuse
  - Children at risk of being marginalised because of multiple deprivation
  - Vulnerable young people marginalised by behavioural problems and personal issues and living in areas of multiple deprivation
  - Part of this is a summer activities fund of £500 for summer projects aimed at 5-17 year olds

**Who can apply?**

- Registered charities
- Small charities are more likely to be successful
- It can take 6 months from the submission of an application for a decision to be made
- Apply via application form available from website

<b>3. Norfolk Youth Fund</b>
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**How much for?**

- The website does not state the maximum amount that can be applied for but it appears that grants have been made from £50 - £50,000

**What for?**

- Projects that:
  - Benefit the applicant and other young people in their area
  - Develop new activities and opportunities for young people aged 13-19
  - Are achievable and good value for money
- Priority is given to projects that include people who may face barriers in getting involved such as:
  - People in care/leaving care
  - People not in education, employment, or training
  - Black, Asian and minority ethnic groups
  - People with learning difficulties
  - People with physical disabilities
  - Travellers
  - Those experiencing rural deprivation
  - Those who speak English as a second language
  - Young parents
  - Young carers

### **Who can apply?**

- Young people aged 13-19 (up to 25 for those with learning difficulties) who live in Norfolk
- Informal small groups of young people or individuals
- Applicants will need a 'support adult' (youth worker/social worker/teacher/parent) etc
- There is an initial application form and if your application meets the criteria, further information will be requested
- Local panels of young people decide which projects should receive grants

## **4. Community Safety Fund (Borough Council of King's Lynn and West Norfolk)**

This fund is not solely focused on young people however many of the projects supported involve young people. Many of these projects provide diversionary activities to discourage involvement in problems such as anti social behaviour, criminal damage, or misuse of drugs etc.

### **How much for?**

- Small grants, usually £200 - £500

### **What for?**

- Applicants must demonstrate how their projects will address one or more of the following priorities:
  - Raise the confidence of communities in the safety of their local area e.g. events to encourage intergenerational communication
  - Reduce the incidence of anti-social behaviour e.g. diversionary art/sport projects for young people, targeting truancy
  - Protect vulnerable people e.g. activities for people with disabilities or older people
  - Improve support to offenders e.g. youth work projects, helping offenders back into work
  - Reduce the harm caused by the misuse of drugs and alcohol e.g. alcohol reduction projects
- The funder is particularly keen to assist with start-up costs for new groups or activities such as stationery, materials, publicity costs and small items of equipment
- For larger projects they would expect to see that other sources of funding are also being used
- Innovative and well planned community led projects, especially those which involve partnerships and a problem solving approach, are likely to receive support

### **Eligible activities include:**

- Youth clubs/young people's activities
- Environmental projects
- Projects for older people or vulnerable people
- Crime prevention measures
- Community safety advice/awareness
- Projects supported in 2008/09 included:
  - The 3 R's Project – a DVD made by young people for young people about the dangers of roads, rivers, and railways
  - A graffiti wall to encourage young people to concentrate their street art at a specific site rather than cause damage to other people's property
  - Two projects about public safety in relation to the night-time economy in King's Lynn

### **Who can apply?/How to apply**

- Community groups
- Registered charities
- Not-for-profit groups
- Parish councils
- Residents associations
- Groups working in partnership with the Borough Council
- They cannot fund retrospectively so please do not begin your project until you receive written notification that you have been successful
- Previous applicants can apply for grants for new projects but not for ongoing costs or repeat activities that have already received funding from the Community Safety Fund
- There is an application form that needs to be completed
- Applications can be made at any time and are usually processed within 4 weeks of submission

<b>5. Norfolk County Council Youth and Community Service (NYCS) and Norfolk Council for Voluntary Youth Services (NCVYS) – Youth Service Partnership Grants</b>
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### **How much for?**

- Will fund up to a maximum of 75% of total costs
- Maximum of £1000
- Up to £325 for start up costs
- Maximum of 75% of total project costs

### **What for?**

- Youth groups, youth organisations, and youth workers, and young people
- Youth groups must have minimum 60% young members aged 11-19 years
- The main purpose of the group must be to deliver youth work/social education to this age group
- The following costs can be funded:
  - Start up costs
  - Development of a programme
  - Specific training for employed and volunteer staff (aged over 16)
  - One off projects or equipment such as: table tennis table, sound system, arts and craft materials, weekend camping trips, stationery, photocopying etc.

### **Who can apply?/How to apply**

- Organisations must be registered on the Norfolk Youth and Community Service schedule of voluntary youth organisations
- Groups need their own bank accounts
- Application forms are available by contacting them or from the website
- Deadlines are 31 January, 30 April, 31 August, 30 November each year
- Grants for individuals aged 11-25 are available from Youthbank (Telephone 01603 485999)

- Up to £1,000

**What for?**

- Open to a wide range of sustainable community projects which involve children and young people aged 11-25 years
- Youth projects have included:
  - Graffiti clean up
  - Arts projects
  - Community gardens/allotments
  - River clean up and angling club
  - Youth warden scheme
  - Sports coaching
  - Redecoration of youth club

**Who can apply?/How to apply**

- Individuals under 18 years old or small groups of people
- Applicants do not need to be part of a formal group but do need support and approval for their idea from a local community group
- Applications can be made at any time using the online application form
- A decision should be made within 28 days
- The grant should be spent within 12 months of it being awarded

**7. Yapp Charitable Trust****Charity Commission no: 1076803****How much for?**

- Normally single year grants of up to £3,000

**What for?**

- Running costs and salaries for small charities to help sustain their existing work
- Various social groups are supported including young people aged 5 – 25 years old
- Priority is given to charities that are:
  - Tackling work that is unattractive to the general public or unpopular with other funders
  - Helping to improve the lives of marginalised, disadvantaged or isolated people
  - Able to demonstrate effective use of volunteers

- Examples of grants made for youth projects include:
  - Clocktower Association - £3,000 towards running costs of a weekly support group for very young mothers
  - MENFA - £9,000 over 3 years towards a Saturday supplementary education club, mainly for ethnic minority children, in Cardiff
  - Teenbridge Project - £4,300 over 2 years for the salary of a youth worker doing street-based work with volunteers on a Teignmouth housing estate

<b>13. WREN</b>
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This is the local distributor for the Landfill Tax Credit Scheme. All projects must be within a 10-mile radius of a Waste Recycling Group (WRG) landfill or transfer site. The relevant sites are at Blackborough End, Feltwell, and March.

**How much for?**

- The maximum is £50,000 but grants tend to be between £5,000 - £20,000
- Third party funding is required and the amount is 11% of the total requested from WREN
- Other match funding is also required

**What for?**

- Community buildings
- Village halls
- Historic buildings
- Places of religious worship
- Provision, maintenance, or improvement of a public park or other public amenity
- Maintenance, repair or restoration of a building open to the public for religious worship or of historic or architectural interest
- Buildings must meet public access requirements (to be available either free of charge or for hire) 2 days a week, 4 evenings a week, 84 days a year, or 12 weeks a year
