Edward Benefer Way to Lynnsport New Access Road – Start of Works

As you may be aware, Norfolk County Council is working in partnership with the Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk on proposals to construct a new access road to the Lynnsport centre from Edward Benefer Way. The works start on 29th February and are being constructed by Tarmac. These works will include the construction of the carriageway and footways, associated signing, lining and traffic signal alterations, improvements to the Lynnsport car parking areas, and the installation of a new piped culvert in place of the open drain running between Edward Benefer Way and Reid Way.

As part of these extensive works, it will be necessary for a series of phased road closures and instances of traffic management to be carried out and maintained. We will endeavour to minimise the inconvenience caused by these occurrences, which are planned as follows:

- Hamburg Way (junction with Edward Benefer Way) – To be closed between 25th April 2016 and 22nd May 2016.
- Spenser Road (junction with Hamburg Way) – To be closed between 13th June 2016 and 12th September 2016.
- Reid Way and Front Way (various locations) – To be closed between 29th September 2016 and 10th October 2016.
- Sandringham Rail Path (various locations) – To be closed at varying short-term intervals between 13th June 2016 and 1st October 2016.

Greenpark Avenue, the existing route into Lynnsport, will also be closed toward the end of the scheme and an alternate route to the Lynnsport centre will be provided.
