



#### Did you know?

All properties have a legal obligation to display the correct street number.



# Why is this necessary?

This is to ensure that buildings are clearly identified, for the convenience of:

- The Public can your customers find you?
- Emergency Services any delay in locating a property could lose valuable minutes in responding to a call.
- Other services mail delivery, taxis and utilities all need to be able to locate properties quickly and easily.

# What's my correct address?

If you are unsure of the correct address of your property please contact the councils AMT, Street Naming and Numbering Officer who will be happy to confirm the relevant details. Contact details are on the back of this leaflet.

#### What should I do now?

Ensure that your number is clearly displayed adjacent to the entrance, or upon the building structure. It should be of an appropriate size and of a contrasting colour with the background, and should be at a convenient height. For examples of good practice, see overleaf...

### Good practice in the Borough



Design and colour contrasts clearly with the background

Numerals or letters of a sufficient size so they are clearly visible from the street



Positioned adjacent to the entrance, or on the building structure (not more than 2.5m above ground)



Listed Buildings – If the building is listed then the proposed display may affect the special character of the building, or require advertisement consent. If you are unsure whether this may affect your property, please contact the Planning Department who will be happy to provide advice.
