The reasons we use your data

The Council may use your data for any of the following purposes; please note this is not an exhaustive list:

- 1. providing evidence in criminal proceedings (Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984 and Criminal Procedure and Investigation Act 1996)
- 2. providing evidence in civil proceedings
- 3. the prevention and reduction of crime and disorder
- 4. the investigation and detection of crime
- 5. identification of witnesses

Why we are allowed to use your data

The Council has a legal obligation to use your data in order to fulfil a public task. These obligations come from various UK laws including but not limited to:

- 1. Section 163 of the Criminal Justice and Public Order Act 1994
- 2. Crime and Disorder Act 1998
- 3. Protection of Freedoms Act 2012
- 4. In certain Circumstances Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act
- 5. Public task Article 6.1(e) the "GDPR" processing is necessary for us to perform a task in the public interest or for our official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law

In some instances, the Council may use your express consent as a means of processing your personal data. The Council will always ask for your permission before doing so.

Who we can share your data with

In some circumstances, it will be necessary to share your information with other departments of the Council or with external third parties, these are:

- 1. Police & other enforcement agencies
- 3. Judicial agencies such as the courts
- 4. Other Local Authorities
- 5. Immigration Service
- 6. Government Departments such as HMRC, DWP etc.

7. Other departments within the Council

When your data gets sent abroad

We do not envisage that any data will be sent abroad.
