

Public Notice inviting representations on the following development plan documents:

- Burnham Market Neighbourhood Plan 2022-2036
- Gayton and Gayton Thorpe Neighbourhood Plan 2019-2036

Town and Country Planning Act 1990 ("the 1990 Act") amended by the Localism Act 2011)

Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 ("the 2012 Regulations") as amended

This Consultation Notice has been prepared in accordance with the 2012 Regulations (as amended), Regulation 16. It gives notice that the Burnham Market, and Gayton and Gayton Thorpe Neighbourhood Plans (submitted for examination in December 2022 and January 2023, respectively) are now published for public consultation.

The Borough Council is now consulting upon the draft Neighbourhood Plans for the Burnham and Gayton Neighbourhood Areas. Comments are invited, regarding whether the two 'plan proposals' (submitted Neighbourhood Plans and supporting documentation) fulfil the "basic conditions", as required by 8(1)(a)(2) of Schedule 4B to the 1990 Act (inserted by the Localism Act 2011). Each plan is supported by the following:

- a) A map identifying the area to which the proposed neighbourhood development plan relates;
- b) A consultation statement:
- c) The proposed neighbourhood development plan;
- d) A statement (the "Basic Conditions Statement") explaining how the proposed neighbourhood development plan meets the requirements of paragraph 8 of Schedule 4B to the 1990 Act.

The 'basic conditions'

Representations received under Regulation 16 regarding the Burnham Market or Gayton and Gayton Thorpe Neighbourhood Plans will be forwarded to an appointed examiner who will assess the Plans and supporting documents against the 'basic conditions', that each Plan:

- 1. Has regard to national policies and advice contained in guidance issued by the Secretary of State:
- 2. Contributes to the achievement of sustainable development;
- 3. Is in general conformity with the strategic policies of the development plan in the area;

- 4. Is compatible with European Union (EU) obligations and European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR); and
- 5. Does not breach the requirements of Chapter 8 of Part 6 of the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017 (7)

Submitting representations under Regulation 16

Comments are sought as to whether the Burnham Market, or Gayton and Gayton Thorpe Neighbourhood Plans (and/ or supporting documentation) fulfil the 'basic conditions'. Copies of the 'plan proposals' and this notice are available for public inspection:
