

# 1. UK Shared Prosperity Funding and Rural England Prosperity Funding so far...

### 1. April 2022 UK Shared Prosperity Funding (UKSPF) launched as part of the Government's Levelling Up Agenda.

### Allocation for West Norfolk of £1,836,407 indicated. UKSPF Prospectus published.

### **BCKLWN** designated as a Lead Local Authority.





2. Metro Dynamics appointed to develop the West Norfolk Investment Plan (WNIP) applying extensive research together with stakeholder consultation.

WNIP approved by the Borough Council's Cabinet committee in July 2022 and submitted to DLUHC August 2022.





West Norfolk Shared Prosperity Fund Programme Development April 2022 – April 2023 3. September 2022 Rural England Prosperity Funding (REPF) announced as a top up capital fund to UKSPF to help address the extra needs and challenges facing rural areas.

Allocation of £1,496,455 for rural West Norfolk indicated, subject to the submission and approval of a rural addendum to the West Norfolk Investment Plan.





4. Rural addendum developed by Borough Council incorporating results from an online stakeholder survey (Oct 2022), the review and consolidation of local, regional and national research data and feedback from REPF Stakeholder meeting.

### **Submitted November 2022.**





5. December 2022 West Norfolk Investment Plan approved by DLUHC, and £1,836,407 UK Shared Prosperity Funding allocation confirmed for investment in King's Lynn and West Norfolk, subject to annual review.





6. February 2023 UKSPF Programme of local delivery for 2022/23 & 2023/24 and REPF Programme of Delivery for 2023/24 & 2024/25 approved by the Borough Council's Cabinet committee.





# 7. February 2023 UKSPF Programme delivery commences for King's Lynn and West Norfolk.





### 8. April 2023. Rural Addendum for West Norfolk approved, and £1,496,455 Rural England Prosperity Funding capital allocation approved for rural West Norfolk.

### REPF Programme delivery commences for rural West Norfolk.


Local investment programme combines direct delivery by BCKLWN, partnership working, third-party delivery and grant schemes.



#### West Norfolk Training Grants 2023-25 £100,000

Micro, small and medium sized businesses and sole traders in west Norfolk can apply for funding for training employees. Grants from £500 up to a maximum of £3,000 per business are available, with the funding covering a maximum of 75% of the total cost of approved training. Delivered by New Anglia LEP and The Growth Hub in partnership with the council.

Towns, villages and hamlets with populations below 10,000 and the wider countryside, and Market or 'hub towns' with populations of up to 30,000 that serve their surrounding rural areas as centres of employment and in providing services.

### West Norfolk Rural Community Capital Grants

Funding is available over two years for community organisations in the rural areas of the Borough of King's Lynn and West Norfolk.

Projects should provide resilient community services and assets for local people to benefit the local economy, address the challenges of rural isolation, support social cohesion and boost local pride.

Applications are open for year 1 from 12th June to 2nd August 2023.

Year 1

2023-24 Grants of up to £10,000

Aim: Support impactful volunteering by the purchase of equipment or improvements to premises.

Following a successful round of applications, 13 projects have been awarded capital grants totalling more than £57,000 through the Rural England Prosperity Fund. West Norfolk Rural Community Capital Grants Awarded
